## CareQuest Institute / OPEN June Poll Methodology

## Four Online Surveys of Registered Voters

- National: 8-minute online survey ( $\mathrm{n}=1,000$ ) of registered voters in the U.S. on the YouGov panel.
- State surveys: Three 12 -minute online surveys of registered voters on the Centiment panel in Michigan ( $n=765$ ), Ohio ( $n=761$ ), and Pennsylvania ( $n=760$ ).
- Study designed and fielded by Marketing for Change Co.
